What we've been doing

7 February 2017

Osmans Close

The task was thinning out holly trees and some laurel. Cleared material was burnt on a bonfire. The small patch of woodland here is made up chiefly of fairly young oak trees, most apparently less than 100 years old, but holly trees have grown up and excluded the light. The wood is home to the silver-washed fritillary (*Argynnis paphia*), which needs both oak trees and violets for the caterpillars. Consequently the aim is to allow light to penetrate under the oak canopy to encourage ground flora such as violets.

Osmans Close

This is 1.56ha (3.85acres) of ancient woodland, although most of the trees now present on site do not appear to be ancient. Osmans Close is one of a series of copses (including Piggy Wood and Whitegrove Copse) which form an important nature reserve and corridor for wildlife. The reserve is owned by Bracknell Forest Council.
