Previous visits

We last visited Snaprails on 17 January 2017; we removed *Rhododendron ponticum* and made some ornamental trelliswork with pieces of *Rhododendron* stem.

On 13 December 2016, we visited Snaprails with Ranger Liz. We planted hedging along the side of the cycle path into the park; this is now growing up nicely. We also cleared rhododendron and bramble and snowberry.

Snaprails Park

Snaprails Park is an area of 3.5 hectares near Owlsmoor in Sandhurst. The Park was formerly the grounds of a 19th Century house. There are open areas, a stream and pond and native woodland. Ornamental trees include giant redwood (*Sequoiadendron giganteum*), swamp cypress (*Taxodium distichum*), coast redwood (*Sequoia sempervirens*) and tulip tree (*Liriodendon tulipifera*). The park came into ownership by Bracknell Forest Borough Council in 1985.
