What we've been doing

16 July 2019

Harvest Hill

There are a number of ponds in the woodland at Harvest Hill. One task today was to dig an overflow pond with a drainage ditch leading to the main pond. The digging was hard work because of the heavy clay not far below the surface and the large number of tree roots. Spades, forks and mattocks had to be used.

Other volunteers donned waders and wellies and cleared the existing ponds of leaves and blanket weed. The material removed from the ponds was extremely smelly!

One section of boardwalk by the main pond was found to need repair.

17 volunteers attended. The weather was sunny and muggy, the shade beneath the trees was very welcome. Many volunteers suffered insect bites despite using insect repellent.

On 20 July, one of our volunteers visited the site at Harvest Hill and found that there was about 5 inches of water in the pond we had dug, the drainage ditch was full of water and water levels in the other ponds had been raised.

23 July 2019

Garth Pond/Meadow

The first task was to remove any Himalayan balsam (*Impatiens glandulifera*) from around Garth Pond and on the stream banks. Another 2 groups had previously worked removing balsam on this site, so in most places there was not a large amount of balsam, but various isolated clumps were removed. Some tidying up of overhanging branches was also done and brambles and nettles were removed from the path. Volunteers donned waders and cleared obstructions from the stream near the bridge.

After lunch, the group moved over the road to Garth Meadow and did some botanical surveying. Some volunteers found it too hot to work in the meadow.

The weather was sunny and very muggy. Temperature was 23°C at 10:00, but had risen to at least the high 20s by the afternoon.

Eighteen volunteers attended.
