What we've been doing

Lockdown 2

Since the last newsletter, another lockdown has been put in place. At the moment, some volunteers are not attending tasks because they do not feel this is in the spirit of the guidance from the government. 10 November 2020

Wykery Copse

9 volunteers attended. We coppiced hazel in a parcel to the left of the boardwalk up to the stream. We finished coppicing in this parcel.

Whitegrove Copse

We cleared bramble from an area marked out by the BFC ranger. Cleared material was placed in habitat piles. Any laurel was kept separate to be removed by the ranger later. Work was started on a second section, but only for about an hour until it was time to pack up.

10 volunteers attended. Weather was mild for the time of year, with some rain later.

One volunteer was stung by a wasp, but did not require treatment.
