What we've been doing

28 February 2023

Popes Meadow

The main task was spreading wood chip around the base of mature oak trees. We also cleared around the base of mature oaks by the car park which had become overgrown with ivy and bramble. Wood chip was barrowed some distance from piles in the wood to the trees and because the trees were surrounded by metal guards we had to form teams and lift each barrow over before emptying - quite hard work!

The weather was overcast and cold. 24 volunteers attended.
