23 May 2023

The tasks were:

- 1. To clear large pond of hawthorn and blackthorn
- 2. Repair fence posts and restaple wire
- 3. At Jocks Lane gate, repair fence inside kissing gate
- 4. Replace fence posts on fence near river
- 5. Sand, stain and colour bridge structure and benches around site

The weather was partly sunny with some wind. 17 volunteers attended.

The task was ragwort pulling, but there was not much ragwort present. Cleared almost all the top field with a small group, including most verges. We were able to see the benefits of our efforts over the last couple of years.

The weather was cool initially, but warm and sunny by coffee time, with a strong breeze.

Ambarrow Court

We dug ditches to connect a damp meadow and pond previously dug by BFC to a drainage ditch the far side of the track, aiming to reduce flooding of the track. We also did some clearance around seating areas.

The weather was overcast with a cool breeze. 15 volunteers attended.

Light weeding was done for all orchard trees, and they were then mulched with some of the wood chip. Weeds for composting were placed in designated areas. We then cleared the edges of local paths, "flicking" the material into the undergrowth.
