What we've been doing

26 September 2023 The Cut (opposite Garth Meadows)

The task was restoration on the bank of the River Cut between the large footbridge and the path crossing halfway on the meadow, i.e. upstream.

Some volunteers worked on clearing blackthorn from the meadow to open up trees; cleared material was burnt on the meadow bonfire site.

Other volunteers cleared vegetation from the river bank, and dragged and burnt it.

The weather was cloudy and warm with some drizzle. 22 volunteers attended.

3 October 2023

Lily Hill Park

The task was to plant about 4500 wild flower plug plants in the meadow near the orchard. Plugs were planted in "divots" where the soil had been scraped off. It was clear that many plugs planted previously had been pulled out, thought to be by magpies. About 1500 plugs were left at the end of our task, the ranger has another group due who will plant the remainder of the plugs.

We held an Emergency General Meeting at coffee time to discuss the proposed change to charitable status for BCV. A lively debate ensued.

Our volunteer Michael J, Norton brought his sawhorse to show volunteers, and we had the opportunity to try using a draw knife to shave off a log.

The weather was sunny periods with some cloud, but dry. We had a good turnout of 22 volunteers. We were very glad to welcome the son of one of our volunteers.
