What we've been doing

21 November 2023

Piggy Wood

Task 1 was to clear the stream between the two bridges and add cleared material to existing habitat piles. A new pile was created and edged with woven hazel and other materials.

Task 2 was to dam up the stream at the top: access was from the second bridge. Dams were built using coppiced material. We also cleared the banks alongside the stream. Wild garlic bulbs were planted at the head of the stream. Brash was piled on a site next to the fence at the head of the stream.

We had a good turnout of 25 volunteers, and were happy to welcome a new volunteer.

The weather was grey, damp and drizzly, with some heavier rain for short periods.

Bucklers Forest

A long walk (about 3000 steps) was needed to reach the site. The task was to cut and burn two clumps of rhododendron. As far as possible the clumps were cut down and then pulled out with the roots.

The weather was cold and clear. 23 volunteers attended. A brimstone butterfly was seen over one of the rhododendron clumps, possibly disturbed from hibernation by our activities.
