

What we've been doing

15 October 2024

Bucklers Park

The task was gorse management, creating 5m wide fire breaks, using the cleared material to refill the dead hedge.

The weather was grey but dry with early morning mist. 20 volunteers attended.

Circle Hill

This was our first visit to this site, which is managed by Crowthorne Parish Council.

The tasks were:

- 1. Cutting back holly and laurel
- 2. Burning cleared material on a bonfire

22 volunteers attended. The weather was dry and mild, but overcast.

Bucklers Park

The main task was to continue preparation of the community garden area, finishing work on the raised beds and paths.

This comprised laying down weed suppressant membrane, laying woodchip on the paths and putting topsoil in the raised beds and using Mypex to cover the beds.

The weather was cloudy and damp, reaching 12.5°C, but there was no rain. 20 volunteers attended.
