The task was planting trees on the boundary after the removal of rhododendron.

The tasks were:

- 1. Remove boardwalk, remove nails from wood
- 2. Replace with hoggin to create raised path
- 3. Construct steps

The tasks were:

- 1. removing old fence line adjacent to Harvest Ride
- 2. opening up footpaths, clearing brambles
- 3. create short section of dead hedge

- 2. Mulch new trees in the community orchard
- 3. Build a bee bank and put up 2 bug hotels

The weather was cloudy and cold. 23 volunteers attended.



The tasks were to remove a boardwalk from road to bridge, to dismantle and remove old nails and put in trailer

The tasks were:

- 1. To continue with the knee rail in the car park
- 2. To start double rail fence around the orchard
